In this article, the author summarizes how the power of the United States to conduct foreign relations is constituted and defined by numerous clauses in the Constitution. After examining these clauses in this light, he makes several conclusions. The author finds that while constitutional limitations abound in each area of foreign relations, there is no definitive understanding of their meaning. In sum, he concludes that the Congress is empowered to formulate the policy; the President conducts the foreign relations subject to the authority of Congress.
